Mission

The mission of Comal ISD is to provide extensive learning opportunities for all students to ensure they become contributing members of our society.

Location

The Comal Independent School District spans 589 square miles of Central Texas, including parts of five counties: Bexar, Comal, Guadalupe, Hays and Kendall. Within the district are the communities of: Bulverde, Canyon Lake, Fischer, Garden Ridge, Hancock, Sattler, Smithson Valley, Spring Branch, Startzville and part of the cities of New Branufels and San Antonio. Major highways crossing the district include Interstate 35, U.S. Highway 281 and Texas Highway 46.

Accreditation

All campuses in Comal ISD are fully accredited by the Texas Education Agency. In addition, each year many CISD schools are recognized by the Texas Education Agency’s Academic Excellence Indicator System (AEIS) for outstanding performance.

Transportation

Services are provided for all students. The district’s bus fleet covers approximately 19,000 miles every day safely delivering students to their campuses in the morning and to their homes in the afternoon. Every year, buses transport students approximately 3,800 miles to field trips and athletic events.
