Campuses celebrate Generation Texas Week by kicking off course selection

Campuses throughout Comal ISD will celebrate Generation Texas Week, Nov. 14-18. The week represents a statewide initiative to organize and mobilize communities to help Texas students and their families pursue the path to college and career education beyond high school.

Course selection will coincide with the designated week as campuses will be conducting curriculum fairs and disseminating the course guides for 2012-13.

Generation Texas Week is directed at students in kindergarten through 12th grade. Counselors at all secondary campuses will be visiting with students regarding course selection. At the elementary level, campuses will focus on college and career education beyond high school. In addition, middle school counselors will visit the elementary schools to assist 5th grade students with their course selection for next year. Eighth grade students

will learn about the course selection process for high school by visiting high school counselors.

Parents and students also have the opportunity to attend curriculum fairs that will be at all four high schools on Wednesday (Nov. 16) evening. Meetings for advanced academics are scheduled and parent assistance sessions are scheduled at some of the campuses on Dec. 1. Elective fairs and parent information nights for next year's 6th grade students will take place at all five middle schools.

Online course selection begins on Nov. 28 and ends Dec. 16.

"The November timeline, while it may seem early, provides us an appropriate amount of time to meet the Alamo Colleges deadlines associated with dual credit requirements, such as testing and application," said Dr. Jodi Duron, assistant superintendent for academics and student services.
