Medications

Medication requiring administration during school hours will be dispensed by the school nurse. The medication needs to be properly labeled and provided in the original bottle. The parent will be responsible for completing a medication administration request. Any medication to be administered longer than 10 days also requires physician consent. Medication administered at school should be limited to that which is required to be given during school hours. Medication to be given up to 3 times a day should be given at home (before school, after school & bedtime), unless ordered otherwise by a physician.

Students may not carry any medication with them to or from school, and while at school.

All medications must be brought to school by an adult, and picked up when it is no longer needed.

Illness and Injury

First aid is provided at school for minor injuries or illness occurring at school only. Injuries which occur at home should be dealt with at home. Serious injuries or illnesses which may require further medical care will be referred to the parents.

If a student is ill in the morning with fever, vomiting, diarrhea, etc., please do not send him/her to school. A student having a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher will not be allowed to stay at school. Medication to control fever is not available at school, and more serious symptoms may be masked by giving such medications. The student must remain at home until the fever has been gone for 24 hours without medication.

Emergencies

It is the parents' responsibility to provide the school with any phone number changes and emergency contacts as soon as possible. It is imperative that we have numbers where we can reach a parent or someone who can act on his/her behalf should an emergency arise. If a child's illness or injury has the potential for being life or limb threatening, we will call the appropriate EMS unit for treatment or transfer to a medical facility. Every effort will be made to reach the parent, without compromising the health & wellbeing of the student.
