

CISD IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2009-2010 SCHOOL YEAR

Childcare and Pre-K

Hib – Four doses or one dose if Hib vaccines first dose was given on or after 15months

Pneumococcal – Four doses unless first dose received after 24 months

Pre-K – 12th grade

Polio - Four polio vaccines are required one of which must have been received on or after the fourth birthday. Or, if the third dose was given on or after the fourth birthday, only three doses are required. Four doses of OPV or IPV in any combination.

Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis –

Five doses in any combination (DTaP/DTP/Tdap) one of which must have been received on or after the fourth birthday.

If fourth dose was received on or after the fourth birthday then only four doses are required.

7th graders - Beginning 2009-2010 students are required to have one booster Tdap **prior** to starting 7th grade unless they have received a Tdap within 5 years. In that case they are required to have a booster Tdap 5 years from their last.

8th-12th – Students are required to have a booster dose of Tdap when 10 yrs have passed from their last dose.

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) – **Two doses** are required with the first dose on or after the first birthday and the second dose by age 5 or **prior** to kindergarten enrollment.

Hepatitis B – **Three doses** are required **prior** to kindergarten enrollment

Varicella – **Two doses** received on or after the first birthday **prior to kindergarten and 7th grade enrollment**. 1st-6th grades and 8th-12th require one dose.

Hepatitis A – **Two doses** with first dose one or after the first birthday (all counties) **prior** to kindergarten enrollment. **1st-12th** require 2 doses only in Bexar county schools (Specht and Timberwood)

Meningococcal – **One dose** required **prior** to **7th grade** enrollment

Tuberculin Skin Testing Protocol:

All public school students entering school for the first time must have one of the following:

- a. a past Tuberculin Skin Test with validated reading on record
- b. a completed Tuberculosis Screening Form. The school nurse or other healthcare professional may require a Tb Skin Test depending on answers to the screening form. Persons with high risk symptoms or conditions are at the highest risk of developing tuberculosis.

The Tuberculosis Screening Form should be used if a student who is transferring from another school does not have a Tb Skin Test on the immunization record.
